

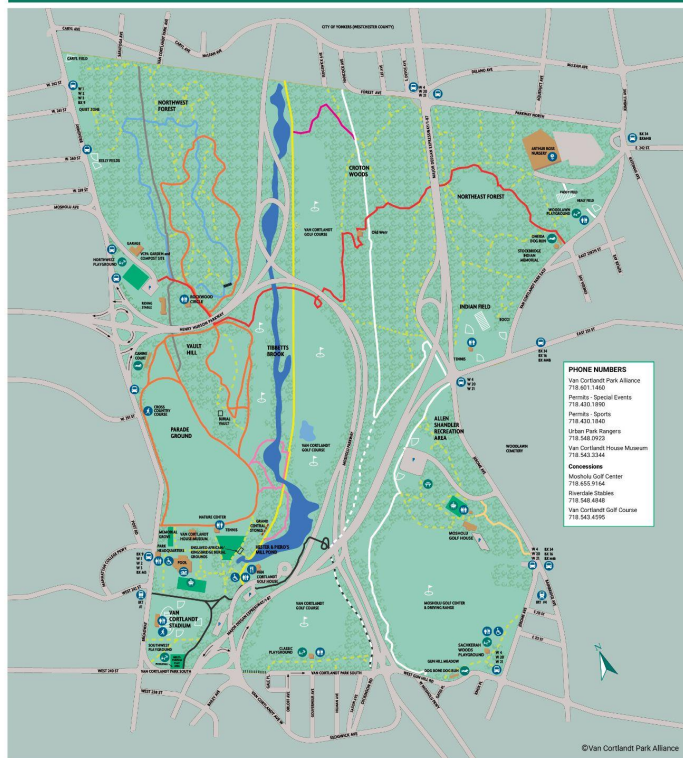


Van Cortlandt Park

- Used by over 2.6 million visitors each year

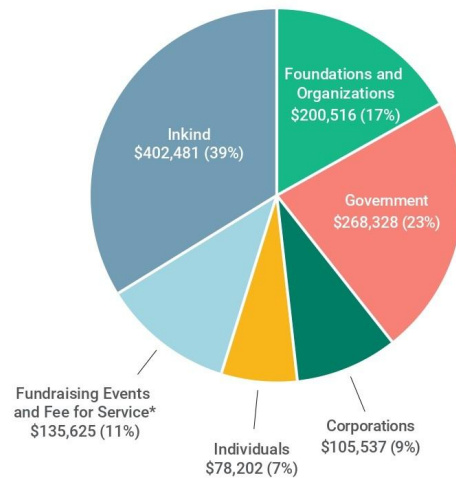

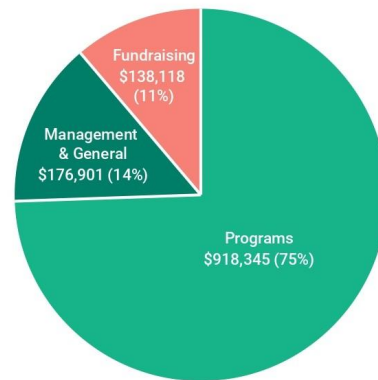
